VOSB/SDVOSB Programs 101

- The Small Business Administration (SBA) and Department of Veterans Affairs (VA) each have "programs" for Veteran Owned Small Businesses (VOSB) and Service-Disabled Veteran Owned Small Businesses (SDVOSB) which related to Federal Contracting.
 - However The 2021 NDAA transferred Government-wide SDVOSB Certification program responsibility to SBA. This process is set to begin January 1,2023
- Eligibility Requirements are unchanged and were consolidated in October 2018 under 13 CFR Part 125

VOSB/SDVOSB Programs 101

SBA

- For SBA, identified as Service-Disabled Veteran-Owned (SDVO) Small Business Concern (SBC) Program
- Applies to contracts with most agencies <u>except</u> the Department of Veteran Affairs*
- Self-certification in SAM (System for Award Management) registration based on specifications in CFR 13, Section 125.13
- No preference over other socio-economic groups
- Eligibility determined on date of bid offer
- VA
 - Verification by the VA Center for Veterans Enterprise (CVE) in Office of Small and Disadvantaged Business Utilization
 - Applies only to VA contracts (or FAA)
 - Veterans Preference for VOSB and SDVOSB
 - Eligibility determined on date of bid and date of award

Key Components of Transfer to SBA

Transition will occur on January 1,2023. Expect a bumpy ride.

Current self-certifications will be grandfathered for a 1year "grace period" past the official transfer date.

Once the grace period ends (January 2024), certification will be required for all SDVOSB set-asides and sole source contracts, government-wide

VA CVE Certification Benefits

- Sole source contracts:
 - Up to \$5 million (VA)
 - Up to \$6.5 million in manufacturing and \$4 million in other industries (SBA)
- Requires determination that agency unlikely to receive offers from two or more SDVOSBs
- Set-Asides
 - VA MUST set aside for SDVOSB before all other socioeconomic categories ("Kingdomware")
- Although not required for Non-VA contracts now, many entities seek verification for marketing purposes
 - Subcontracting opportunities to meet primes' subcontracting goals
 - May increase chance of "landing" qualified mentor under SBA All Small Mentor-Protégé Program

VA CVE Eligibility Overview

- Small business in Primary NAICS code
- Veteran Status and Disability Status
- Ownership by Veteran(s) (and in some circumstances the surviving spouse or permanent caregiver)
- Management and daily operations controlled by Veteran(s)
- "Good Character"
 - Ineligible if knowingly submit false information, and/or
 - failed to pay significant financial obligations, to include taxes and loans

Eligibility - Veteran Status

Veteran has the meaning provided in 38 U.S.C. 101(2).



- A Veteran is a person who served on active duty with the Army, Air Force, Navy, Marine Corps, or Coast Guard for any length of time and who was discharged or released under conditions other than dishonorable. Reservists or members of the National Guard called to <u>federal</u> active duty or disabled from a disease or injury incurred or aggravated in the line of duty or while in training status also qualify as Veterans.
- A Service-disabled Veteran is a Veteran who possesses either a disability rating letter issued by VA establishing a Service-connected rating between 0 and 100 percent, or a disability determination from the Department of Defense.

Important Definitions: Veteran Status

- Service-connected has the meaning given that term in 38 U.S.C. 101(16). The term "service-connected" means, with respect to disability or death, that such disability was incurred or aggravated, or that the death resulted from a disability incurred or aggravated, in line of duty in the active military, naval, air or space service.
- Service-disabled veteran is a veteran who possesses either a valid disability rating letter issued by the Department of Veterans Affairs, establishing a service-connected rating **between 0 and 100 percent**, or a valid disability determination from the Department of Defense or is registered in the Beneficiary Identification and Records Locator Subsystem (BIRLS) maintained by Department of Veterans Affairs' Veterans Benefits Administration as a service-disabled veteran.

Eligibility - Ownership

- In accordance with 13 CFR 125.11 and 13 CFR 125.12 Veteran(s) must own a minimum of 51% of the business, and;
- Ownership must be direct
 - Limited exception for certain trusts
- Ownership must be unconditional
- Veteran(s) must be entitled to
 - at least 51% annual distribution profits,
 - Profits commensurate with ownership percentage
 - at least 51% of retained earnings and 100% of unencumbered value of ownership in event of dissolution

Eligibility - Control

Veteran(s) must control all long-term decision making

- Veteran(s) must control all day-to-day management and administration of business operations
- Must hold highest officer position within company (i.e. CEO, President, Managing Member)
- Must possess appropriate managerial experience to extent and complexity necessary to run concern.

Eligibility - Control cont.

Veterans must be able to overcome all super majority and unanimity voting requirements <u>except</u> in the following five, and <u>only five</u>, circumstances:

- Bankruptcy
- Dissolution
- Sale
- Merger
- Adding a new equity stakeholder

Rebuttable Presumptions

13 CFR 125.13(i) provides for a rebuttable presumption that nonservice-disabled veteran individuals or entities control or have the power to control a firm in certain circumstances




Applying for Verification

- Verification is performed 100% online: <u>https://www.vetbiz.va.gov/</u>
- <u>All owners (or members) need to access the system</u>
 - obtain a DS Logon account (Veterans only) or ID.me account
 - Upload own resume
 - Upload individual taxes (if applicable some exceptions exist)
 - Sign 0877 (Each Business Owner/Stockholder/Surviving Spouse)
- Required documentation list
 - Required Documents For Verification · VetBiz Portal (va.gov)
- Specified for each business structure Sole Proprietorship, LLC, Partnership and Corporation - ensure select proper option in dropdown

Vendor Information Pages - Tab

- Owner/Rep Dashboard Lists one or more business if common Owner
 - Business Information Tab
 - Task List Assigned by CVE during the process
 - Messages Communications from Reviewers
 - Archive Consolidation of ALL documents uploaded
- Pre-Qualification Quiz Same as Home page
- Apply for Verification Finally!

VA CVE Portal

- Each section identifies documents CVE requires
 - Should you not have a document, must include a Detailed Letter of Explanation (DLOE)
 - Consult with PTAC counselor for assistance
- Must complete all sections, have all owners sign 0877, and upload resumes (and applicable taxes) to be allowed to submit application. System will provide list of outstanding items.
- After submission will be assigned a Case Analyst
 - Develop relationship!

Tips

- Ensure SAM Registration up to date. VIP will pull NAICS Codes from SAM upon initial registration.
 - System allows removal of codes, but not additions.
- When reviewing documents VA is primarily concerned with the Veteran being in control.
 - Contracts: VA wants to see Veteran Owner signed
 - Dependency upon non-veterans is "red flag"
 - Sharing of employees
 - Critical license held by non-veteran
 - Non-Veteran with equity interest provides critical financial or bonding support
- Detailed Letter(s) of Explanation can help clarify and avoid further questions.
 - Work with PTAC Counselor

- All applicants must submit:
 - Business Taxes for prior three years
 - Any applicable licenses
 - Resumes for all owners/members
 - Payroll documentation for prior year and current YTD
 - Signature Cards for bank
 - Contracts
 - Lease agreement
 - Applicable formation documentation
 - Any applicable Franchise Agreement
 - Applicable Joint Venture or Mentor-Protégé Agreement(s)

- Do you intend to bid on VA (or FAA)contracts? Or Subcontracts with VA Prime Contractors?
- Do you already perform work with the VA?
- Do you wish to use the CVE verification logo for marketing purposes?

Marketing Your CVE Verified Status

- Use the logo on your webpage, capability statement, business cards
- Understand that the SDVOSB status is a door opener, not an entitlement
- It can be helpful to have SDVOSB competitors otherwise, no set asides
- VOSB carries little weight outside of VA
 - only VA has a VOSB goal, however agencies tend to be pro-VOSB and try to ensure fair consideration
- SDVOSB status can set you up to be a protégé in a M/P relationship
- Take advantage of VBOC Services <u>Veterans Business Outreach</u> <u>Center (VBOC) (cweonline.org)</u> Covers all of New England
